Mission:

The mission of Northern Star Scouting Outreach Committee is to provide training, resources, support to build community relationships in an effort to achieve the goals described in the Northern Star Scouting Mission Statement and the Northern Star Scouting Diversity Statement.

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- The committee did review this in 2023, and the new Mission Statement, above, has been created.
- Create a Welcome to Scouting booklet that will have an FAQ section for unit leaders to help with Outreach and provide D, E, I & B info and resources.
- Work with all other Council Committees and the Council Commissioner Corps on goals for 2025 in areas of Outreach and Diversity.
 - The Outreach Committee did provide committee members to other Council Committees and the Commissioner Corps in 2025. They acted as liaisons between the committees, facilitated D, E, I & B collaborations and understandings.
- Continue to provide Outreach and Diversity, Equity, Inclusion & Belonging trainings at University of Scouting events. Provide a forum for Scout leaders to help them with specific concerns, questions, issues, etc. at these University of Scouting events.
- Submit recommendations for D, E, I & B policies/guiding principles.

Secondary Objectives

- Review and update as needed our Resource Guide, content and delivery.
- Continue to provide Diversity, Equity, Inclusion & B trainings at College of Commissioner Service.
- Continue to promote, support, and continue the updating of the *Northern Star Scouting Diversity Awards*.
- Promote and support *Citizenship in Society, American Cultures* and *Disabilities Awareness* merit badges.
- Promote the national on-line D, E & I training course.
- Provide a list of other organizations that connect cultures, heritages, ethnicities, organizations specializing in D, E & I, etc.
- Identify other organizations that we can partner with and deliver Northern Star programs.
- Increase the size and diversify the make-up of our Outreach Committee.

- Conduct monthly meetings to review goals.
- Outreach Committee members will take on specific goals with established timelines.
- The Outreach Committee is creating a report card / dashboard.
