Northern Star Scouting Resources in Tackling Inclusion Barriers

"It is the philosophy of Scouting to welcome all eligible youth, regardless of gender, race, ethnic background, sexual orientation, or gender identification, who are willing to accept Scouting's values and meet any other requirements of membership."



Diversity Facets & Inclusion Barriers

Race & Ethnicity

Scouting welcomes people of ALL races & ethnicities in our programs.

Language

People who speak any language can join the Scouting program.

■ <u>Age</u>

People of ALL ages are allowed join the Scouting program as long as they meet the physical requirements of the activities.

Religion & Worship Schedule

People of ALL religions or NO religion can join the Scouting program.

Family Structure

Unit Committees are encouraged to work with families of diverse family structures to encourage scouting event participation.

Social-Economic

People of any social-economic backgrounds are welcomed in Scouting. Financial Assistance for registration is available. "No child will be turned away for inability to pay".

Gender & Identity

Youth are encouraged to join the unit that they feel comfortable with regarding their gender identity.

(Contact Council Staff for resources.)

Sexual Orientation

BSA welcomes youth and adults regardless of their sexual orientation.

Dietary Restriction

Event planners are recommended to work with member families regarding dietary restrictions for trips & events.

Accessibility & Mobility

Event planners are encouraged to make provisions for participants regarding accessibility & mobility.

Digital Media Inclusion

Information in alternate format should be provided to members to address digital and online accessibility & readability concerns.

Political Belief

ALL who accept Scouting's values and meet other requirements of membership can join Scouting.

Special Needs

Resources and support are in place for anyone with special needs to be a part of Scouting.

Physical Size & Ability

Event planners are encouraged to make provisions for participants regarding physical size (e.g., height, weight) and ability (e.g., strength, stamina.)

Mental & Physical Health Challenges

Resources and support for anyone with mental and physical health challenges who want to be a part of Scouting.

Strategies In Planning Starts with Awareness & Education

"To be Understood, First Seek to Understand"

- 1. Understand your Demographics Look Around
 - Survey the diversity facets & inclusion barriers in your district.
 - Look for new contact connections during Commissioner unit visits.
- 2. Understand your Communities Look Outward
 - What does Scouting mean to those in the more diverse communities?
 - Ask, "What do your youth like to do for fun?"
 - o Partner with their community leaders and find common ground.
 - Wear a casual Scouting or camp shirt when greeting them not the official uniform (unless it's in a Scouting function.)

3. Understand how those of us in Scouting Deal with Diversity? - Look Inward

- What do Diversity & Inclusion mean to our Scouts, leaders, and volunteers?
 - o Are they DEI-trained?
 - Northern Star Scouting has classes at Spring & Fall University of Scouting to educate volunteers in Diversity-Equity-Inclusion and recruiting from under-served communities.
- How do they treat each other in the unit, in the Scouting community?
 - Any kind of bullying or name-calling is not allowed in Scouting.
- If any inclusion barriers come up, consult with Council Staff for resources to assist.

Annual Planning / Action Plan – Seasonal Strategies to be Visible and Welcoming

Consider integrating DEI awareness and planning as part of your scouting support work in District / Community / Unit Level:

- 1) **Spring** (Mar-May) Survey/Update Community Demographics
 - Sync up with Review & Reflection in Roadmap to Success
- 2) **Summer** (Jun-Aug) Formulate
 - District/Community/Unit DEI Action Plan & Schedule
 - Consider cultural/sports/fun events year-round (see list of Multicultural examples above.)
- 3) Fall (Sep-Nov) Executing your year-round DEI Action Plan
 - Bring DEI Training to your Volunteers.
 - Connect with community partners to support & promote.
- 4) Winter (Dec-Feb) DEI Action Plan Lessons Learned Review & Reflection
 - Update Action Plan for Next Program Year
