L'Étoile du Nord Trail (Trail of the North Star) has been established in the downtown area of St. Paul. The Trail is intended to familiarize hikers with an area of great historical value.

IMPORTANT NOTES

1. Vehicles may be parked free on the streets adjacent to the Cathedral, in designated areas.
2. There is no time limit to finish the hike. Take your time and enjoy the buildings and the surroundings as you go.
3. Wear sensible shoes. This walk is mostly on concrete.
4. Obey all traffic signals at intersections.
5. Water and restrooms are available in public buildings at many places along the trail.
6. DO NOT LITTER. If you eat on the trail, dispose of litter in the proper trash cans.
7. Many questions are intended for educational value, while others are just for fun.

8. Some locations have free information brochures which you can read later for more information.
