Torch of Gold



The Torch of Gold is a council-level distinguished award of the BSA. It recognizes one adult per council for exceptional service and leadership in working with Scouts who have special needs, within a unit, district, and/ or council. The service can range from developing/incorporating special accommodations, to providing advocacy, to promoting awareness of disabilities/special needs among Scouts, Scout Leaders, or the community they serve.

The nominee must be a current registered member of the BSA and must have completed at least three years of Scouting leadership to youth with disabilities in BSA programs. This includes educating other Scouts about disabilities and working with youth who have special needs.



Rich Greiner District I

Rich Greiner is dedicated to helping others navigate the complexities of working with Scouts with disabilties or special needs.

He travels across the council to train units, has developed two courses for University of Scouting focused on special needs and disabilities, and supported Scouts and families with special needs during the 2023 National Jamboree.

Silver Beaver Award



The Silver Beaver Award was introduced in 1931 and is a national distinguished service award. It's the highest level of recognition that a local council, with approval of the National Council BSA, can give to a volunteer. Recipients are registered Scouters who have made a significant impact on the lives of youth through service given to Scouting and the community.
